

## Activities to go with Jazzy Shapes

### Concentration!

1. Print and use the matching game.
2. Print two copies of the concentration pages. Cut out and laminate (or laminate and then cut out) into equal sized squares. Teach game to children. Play as group or in self guided playtime.
3. Using these square cutouts, have students find objects in the room that match the tile they received.
4. Print out several copies each of the concentration game tiles. Have students hold up the correct shape as you read the book. You can also put them on popsicle sticks and do the same activity.

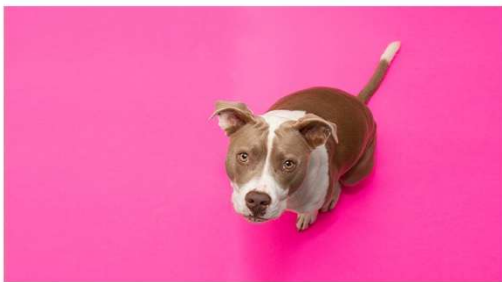

## Activities to go with Jazzy Shapes

### Shapes and popsicle sticks

Materials: Jazzy Shapes book, print the cut out shapes from the book, laminate if needed. (You could also just hand each child the entire page.) Popsicle sticks, pipe cleaners & other craft items to outline the shapes.

Using popsicle sticks, pipe cleaners or other craft items, have the students glue the items to the edges of each picture.

Discussion points: What did they need to use to trace the rounded shapes? (The popsicle sticks won't work.)

They may also say that the poly and hexagon's are not in the book. You can tell them the author didn't think of it or some other reason that could make them laugh. They may ask why there is no picture of the cube and other 3d shapes. Have that lesson at hand as well. (You can't trace really draw them on paper and outline them with popsicle sticks)

Note: I found an activity online where the teacher had color coded the sticks and wrote the name of the shape on the sticks as well. This might be helpful in the beginning.
